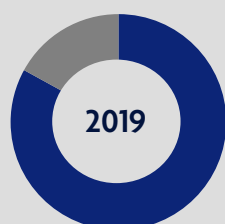

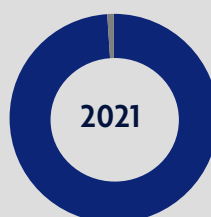

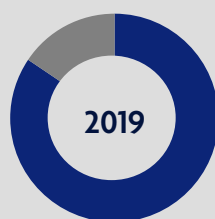


● Domestic Spending:

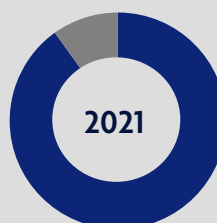
